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Collaboration

ForestFit™ was born out of the forestry sector's desire to have an assurance process which demonstrated that forest service businesses had capabilities beyond service delivery, in areas such as work health and safety, environmental management and sustainable business practices.

With much hard work and industry support, ForestFit™ became fully operational in June 2022. With an assurance process in place comprising the nationally accredited Standards and Certification Scheme it became evident that forest growers needed assistance.

Over the past three years, ForestFit™ has worked proactively across the sector to build an assurance process for growers engaging ForestFit™ certified forest service businesses. The project steering committee had representatives from over 80% of the largest growers in the country and ForestFit certified businesses.

Australian Forest Industries ForestFit Memorandum of Understanding

In addition to the successful project delivery, the growers and the Australian Forest Products Association (AFCA) who is the owner ForestFit™ and national peak body for forest services, acknowledged that the ongoing operation and maintenance of ForestFit™ is in the overall interest of the production forestry sector. By becoming signatories to the MOU, all parties demonstrated their support for the future direction of the industry and increase overall confidence of the efficiencies and benefits for forest services in becoming certified.

Time to grow

ForestFit™ has become recognised as the benchmark for sustainable self-managed businesses providing forestry services across Australia. It provides opportunity to build improved sustainable and efficient forest service provision and commercial relationships. Our ambition is that ForestFit™ be recognised as a preferred prerequisite for all forest growers across Australia.

To achieve this, those across the sector who sought for a standard to be developed are now called upon to evaluate their internal commercial management processes and consider if they are delivering the assurance, efficiency and performance how the inclusion of ForestFit™ as a preferred or mandatory requirement may improve delivery of quality assurance, efficiency and performance.

Similarily, forest service businesses who wants to showcase their professionalism, support their valuable employees and run a more sustainable business are encouraged not to wait for the growers to demand it, look today at what ForestFit[™] has to offer.

In a world of increasing compliance, stretched human resources and squeezed margins, maximising the value from your forest service business relationships has never been more critical.


Australia became the first country to establish a national Standard and Certification Scheme for forest service businesses, but like any novel innovation it came with challenges.

The ForestFit™ Standard certifies Australian forest service businesses and sits in alignment with the Forest Stewardship Council and Responsible Wood to provide assurance through the forestry supply chain.

Whilst ForestFit[™] set a new international standard for safety, sustainability and commercial management of forest service businesses, it also challenged forest growers and managers to evaluate their internal commercial management process and consider if those processes were delivering the required assurance, efficiency and performance.

Leveraging the success of the initial ForestFit™ development project and the experiences of the early adopter forest service businesses, a three year research pilot was undertaken to:

- Collaboratively evolve the commercial relationship within the sector to improve risk and liability management and support all to prosper in the medium to long term.
- Develop a Forest Services Commercial Management model that underpins the growers' commitments embodied in the Australian Forest Industries ForestFit™ Memorandum of Understanding.
- Assess how forest grower incentivisation of ForestFit™ certification for forest service businesses will increase business viability, work health and safety performance and environmental outcomes.



Continuous improvement

The 2022-25 pilot research program aimed to clarify and evolve the commercial management of certified forest service businesses (businesses) by forest growers (growers). The commercial management model provides guidance to growers for best leveraging the capability of ForestFit™ certified businesses through the engagement, commencement, implementation and reporting and review cycle.

The national Forest Services Commercial Management Steering Committee (SC), was convened by growers and supported by AFCA, to drive long-term industry transformation, which included:

- Identifying how grower cost savings from reduced assessment activities and management of certified businesss will be recognised and incentivised for ForestFit™ certified businesses.
- Exploring alignment and streamlining of current audit arrangements with ForestFit™ Certification.
- Cooperating and working together to maximise efforts and resources.
- Sharing consistent information and messages.
- Developing a transition pathway for growers.

Sector continuous improvement was the primary purpose of the project. The initial focus from the outset was to create consistency and efficiencies by eliminating audit duplication and burden with a nationally agreed upon optimal auditing pathway.

However, the mapping of the existing sector processes highlighted opportunities to improve delivery of due diligence and compliance. The project was strategically broadened to include reviewing the overall commercial management relationship, particularly risk and liabilities. This resulted in the renaming the model underpinning the Australian Forest Industries ForestFit™ MOU.

Project Funding

ForestFitTM

ForestFit™ is fully operational

With much hard work and industry support ForestFit[™] has been fully operational since June 2022. ForestFit[™] comprises a range of training, assurance, standards and certification, specifically contextualised for forest service businesses, which are currently being utilised across the sector, with:

- 16 business owners, leaders and emerging leaders have undertaken the ForestFit™ Training Program.
- 5 forest service business are currently certified.
- 8 forest service businesses are currently undertaking certification.
- 8 growers have indicated that ForestFit™ certification is a preferred capability within service provision tenders or contracts.

ForestFit™ Standards and Certification Scheme provide a whole of business approach to support sustainable, safe and environmental business practices to strengthen future viability. ForestFit™ was codesigned by representatives of the entire forestry supply chain to certify that forest service businesses meet the evolving needs of the industry and international standards.

The ForestFit™ Certification Scheme meets the international requirements set by International Accreditation Forum (IAF) resulting in JASANZ endorsement. ForestFit™ is owned by AFCA and as per certification scheme requirements, ForestFit™ is governed by a nine member Governing Advisory Panel (GAP). The daily administration of ForestFit™ is undertaken by the ForestFit™ team contracted to AFCA.

In 2024 the scheme successfully underwent its inaugural Scheme Review and Standards Revision process. In addition, to support the continuous improvement philosophy the scheme is undertaking implementation case studies to understand how businesses new to certification engage with the standard and evolve their commercial relationships with the engaging grower.



Deemed to Comply

To reduce audit duplication a Deemed to Comply agreement has been established with Responsible Wood for the forest services specific criteria. Certified businesses are audited annually to these criteria as part of their ForestFit™ Surveillance therefore are expected to be excluded from the sample selected as part of the forest grower's AS/NZS 4708 audit.

FSC-STD-AUS-01-2018 is being revised which may include criteria recognising certificate holder use of non-FSC third party contractor certification schemes to demonstrate compliance (eg ForestFit™). In lieu of this criteria acceptance, a Deemed to Comply will be pursued with FSC.

ForestFit™ is aligned to work together with Responsible Wood and FSC to provide assurance across the supply chain.

Growers supporting ForestFitTM certification

The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) outlines the shared support for the successful implementation and maintenance of ForestFit™. It sets the terms of understanding between the grower signatories and AFCA as the owner of ForestFit™ and representative national peak body for forest service businesses. The parties together will advocate for and where practicable support certification to the ForestFit™ Standard.

For the purposes of procurement the growers have committed to:

- Preference ForestFit[™] certified businesses
- Accept that ForestFit[™] meets the same requirements for management systems as certified or aligned to the respective ISO standards.
- After 31 December 2024, support businesses entering new contracts with growers to be certified to a minimum of Standard 1: Mandatory Requirements and Standard 3: Work, Health and Safety.

Upon finalising the Forest Services Commercial Management model, growers will align their businesses processes to this national model.

Factors for change

The forest sector is experiencing increasing pressure on the availability of employees and businesses to meet ever increasing demands. Therefore, it is critical for growers to leverage the expertise and maximum capabilities of forest service businesses to meet the grower's commercial needs.

This need is occurring in an environment when growers commonly have reduced support and are relying upon the systems and resources of the forest service businesses they engage.

Grower expectations of forest service businesses now go well beyond production and value recovery, it also requires verifiable:

- Safe work practices
- International Labour Organisation (ILO) aligned work practices,
- Environmental protection,
- Chain of custody management
- Chain of responsibility delivery
- Commercial sustainability.

To survive these pressures the capabilities of all involved in the commercial relationship must evolve. The utilisation of capabilities that exist beyond core operational tasks must be understood and recognised.

What is being transformed

Service provision

Service provision in the forestry sector, like most sectors, is delivered through a variety of arrangements. This spectrum ranges from internal employees through to third party contracts. On this spectrum are sole providers and forest service businesses utilised to deliver single jobs or ongoing complex services.

The traditional service commercial arrangement utilised within the forest sector strongly emphasised production capacity as the key performance indicator. Growers manage the engagement through "supervision" utilising activities such as operational "monitoring" and "auditing".

Given the diversity of forest services being delivered it is acknowledged that the capabilities of those providing the services also varies. This may also be influenced by the maturity and size of the business.

While there was value obtained from this model, it had a potential to view the forest services delivered by businesses solely through an operational lens. This overlooked the capacity for self management, continuous improvement and governance which these businesses could also deliver.

A more mature commercial arrangment recognises the management capabilities of forest service businesses to provide a higher level service, greater assurance and improved outcomes.

Internal and external capacity building

Independent third party assurance of a forest service business' sustainability and management systems adds value to the service they provide. However the businesses need some flexibility to determine the appropriate time in which to pursue certification and confidence of transparent grower recognition of the value.

ForestFit™ certification is a lead indicator that demonstrates to growers that certified businesses are able to engage on a higher level than non-certified businesses. However, growers need some flexibility to consider when it may be a preference or a requirement for engagement.

The forest services commercial management model demonstrates how engaging a service provider with external assurance can lead to safer, more productive and sustainable business relationships in the short and long term.

This model identifies that both parties are able and willing build stronger and more professional commercial relationships. This is important as it is this relationship between the grower and certified business is critical to achieving commercial, safety and environmental outcomes.

For example, a ForestFit™ certified business enables the conversation between the grower and the forest service provider to evolve from one of supervision and minor non conformances to be about outcomes, continuous improvements and performance.

Assurance spectrum: Advantages of standardisation

ForestFit™ provides business assurance at the highest level with options to include assurance standards covering safety, environment and/or business management.

ForestFit™ is suitable for businesses who want to assure their systems, demonstrate their professional performance and develop longer term sustainable business relationships.

It may not be possible or desirable for all situations or service providers to meet the ForestFit™ Standard. In these instances alternative assurance systems may be utilised by engaging businesses or contractors.

For example, growers may only wish to have assurance regarding specific safety criteria therefore audits such as the Forest Owner and Service Provider (FOSP) audit may be appropriate if broader business assurance is delivered through internal monitoring and controls.

Alternatively, closely supervised and managed service providers may require no external assurance as they are managed under the grower's systems, therefore deemed as employees by the grower.

Forest service businesses are very diverse across industry, however over time it is envisaged that the value of ForestFit™ certification will be demonstrated across the sector and it will become the norm for the majority of commercial arrangements.

What is critical is that businesses within the sector who engage forest service businesses are clear on the level of assurance and governance that they require and that they have internal and/or external processes that meet those expectations.

All levels of management must understand what each assurance process delivers.

Since 2010 HQP has been managing 300,000 heactares of certified plantations across Queensland.

Jones Group became HQP's first harvest and haulage business in 2011.

CURRENT ASSURANCE PROCESS

HQP assessment program includes planned audits, inspections and checks. Duplication of internal processes was identified, to the extent that some businesses are having more than 3 times the number of planned site visits.

FORESTFIT™ CERTIFIED ASSURANCE PROCESS

HQP participated in the ForestFit[™] pilot with select businesses to assess its benefits and plans to expand over the next three years.

ForestFit™ certification will be embedded in their commercial agreements to ensure consistent standards and assurance.

ADVANTAGES OF CERTIFIED ASSURANCE: HQP AND JONES GROUP PERSPECTIVE

ForestFit™ is helping HQP and Jones Group strengthen their commercial relationship through increased transparency, clearer expectations and a shift toward more accountable selfmanaged practices.

Key insights as presented by Daniel Pfrunder (HQP) and Luke Jones (Jones Group):

- ForestFit™ allows businesses to take ownership of outcomes and demonstrate compliance to HOP.
- The integration of ForestFit™ digital systems supports stronger collaboration and trust.
- The process supports a shift towards self-management and reduced industry risk.
- ForestFit™ is standardising practices and simplifying commercial agreements
- Opportunities exist to align with NHVR standards.
- ForestFit is contributing to a more mature and accountable industry culture.
- Broad industry participation, evolving attitudes and recent challenges are driving the shift.
- Growing interest and support for businesses working through certification are helping drive uptake.

Together, HQP and Jones Group see ForestFit™ as a key step toward future-proofing operations and strengthening industry partnerships.

Forico, established in 2014, manages over 170,000 hectares of land across Tasmania.

Since inception in 2018, JCH Harvest has delivered safe and sustainable harvesting for Forico.

CURRENT ASSURANCE PROCESS

Forico conducts monthly audits on all sites for all forest service providers, focusing on quality over minor compliance.

However, significant duplication highlighted the need for streamlined assurance.

FORESTFIT™ CERTIFIED ASSURANCE PROCESS

Forico has integrated ForestFit™ certification into commercial agreements, recognising its role in improving business governance and streamlining operational processes.

ADVANTAGES OF CERTIFIED ASSURANCE: FORICO AND JCH HARVEST PERSPECTIVE

ForestFit[™] has played a key role in evolving the commercial relationship between Forico and JCH Harvest. It has built trust, aligned systems and realised shared efficiencies through capability, knowledge and collaboration.

Key insights as presented by Ben Roberts (Forico) and Lauren Carter (JCH):

- As a new entrant, JCH demonstrated that the perception that ForestFit™ might be too complex for new entrants to the industry was invalid.
- The shift from compliance checks to value-driven conversations has improved safety, planning and efficiency.
- Utilising the independent third-party assurance of ForestFit™ eliminated an identified duplication of over 200 data points.
- Monthly audits now occur as part of the site handover rather than interrupting operations.
- ForestFit™ replaced FOSP audits, provviding deeper insights into systems and practices.
- Governance, incident reporting and overall business practices improved with streamlined reporting from lengthy PDFs to practical formats.
- Collaboration with operators enhances site planning and operational efficiency.

The process reinforced Tasmania's high standards and the vital role of trust in grower and forest service business relationships.

PARTNERSHIP BACKGROUND

HVP manages over 240,000 hectares of plantations across Victoria.

Austimber has provided harvest and haulage services since 2006, driven by a strong focus on innovation.

CURRENT ASSURANCE PROCESS

HVP relies on management reviews with key stakeholders to monitor performance and compliance. While valuable, the process involves duplication and inefficiencies, highlighting an opportunity for a more streamlined approach.

ADVANTAGES OF CERTIFIED ASSURANCE: HVP AND AUSTIMBER PERSPECTIVE

HVP and Austimber recognise the value of the current management review process and expect it to remian part a key part of their assurance framework. They also see opportunities to refine and streamline the process.

Key insights as presented by John Love (HVP) and Ian Reid (Austimber):

- The existing formal annual and informal six-monthly management reviews are valuable touchpoints involving regional and harvesting managers, district foresters, harvesting businesses and crew leaders.
- These reviews encourage an open dialogue and promote a shared understanding.
- There is a clear opportunity to review HVP duplication and streamline assurance activities to improve efficiency.
- While ForestFit™ is not yet been recognised as part of the system, there is an opportunity to consider where its inclusion can add value.
- Effective record keeping that adds value is critical, as concerns were raised over processes that do not add value.

HVP and Austimber expect the management review process to evolve by streamlining processes and integrating ForestFit.

FORESTFIT™ CERTIFIED ASSURANCE PROCESS

HVP has been an active representative on the Steering Committee. While not yet a formal MOU signatory, they have used the pilot to work with Austimber, an early ForestFit™ adopter, to explore integration opportunities and streamline processes.

Professional relationships

ForestFit™ certified businesses have demonstrated their capacity to professionally manage their business activities with a high level of assurance. To gain most value from this assurance growers should evolve their commercial engagment and management from a supervisiory model to a professional commercial relationship.

To achieve this both the grower and service business must build mutual respect through collaboration, transparency and communications. This does not impact the frequency of engagement between the parties, instead the conversations move from minor level compliance to continuous improvement.

The ForestFit™ commercial management model proposes that from engagement, to onboarding to operations, a high level of business engagement should be aimed for, leveraging the internal processes assured through ForestFit™ certification.

Growers can also leverage the expertise of certifed businesses to provide solutions for industry-wide operational issues or incidences. Growers can engage with the ForestFit team to include, where applicable, assurance through the annual surveillance audit process that these issues have been addressed through appropriate policies, procedures, risk assessments and change management processes.

The least preferred outcome is that growers encourage businesses to become ForestFit™ certified and then do not leverage the capabilities of the business which the certification process assures.

Creating a common language

The key assessment activities required during the operations management stage have been identified, defined and agreed upon by the Steering Committee (July 2023) to create a 'common language' for growers and forest service businesses that are ForestFit™ certified. These definitions were reviewed and updated (June 2025) to reflect more specifically the commercial management model for certified businesses.

AUDIT [Annual]

A systematic, independent and documented process by a Certification Body (third party) for obtaining evidence and evaluating it objectively to determine if the audit criteria is fulfilled.

CRITERIA

Work Health and Safety Environmental Practices Mandatory Requirements (People) Business Sustainability

VALUE

Reputable assurance and confidence for all stakeholders, including Grower and forest service business, that the systems and processes are risked based, successfully operationalised and continuously improved.

VERIFICATION

A documented process by the Grower or its agent (second party) to assure the information provided is valid and compliant with contractual requirements and system implementation.

Work Health and Safety Environmental Practices Mandatory Requirements (People) Business Sustainability

A validated approach confirming systems and processes are implemented and assessed. Undertaken when a new process occurs (ie new contract) and as part of commercial risk assessment activities.

COMPLIANCE

A documented systematic check conducted by the forest service business (first party) to ensure adherence to the required laws, regulations, policies or standards. Involves document reviews, conducting interviews and inspecting operations and sites.

Work Health and Safety Environment

A risk based approach to systematically assess, manage and implement systems and processes to ensure responsibilities and obligations are met.

INSPECTION

A documented visual examination process by the forest service business (first party) to assess the condition of a site, operation, system or process for a specific purpose, such as identifying safety hazards, quality controls or environmental concerns.

Work Health and Safety Environment

Systematic monitoring of on site processes, ensuring alignment with sustainable practices and identifying opportunities for improvement, including areas that may pose new risks.

OBSERVATION

[Minimum weekly]

A physical examination completed by the forest service business (first party) of a site, operation or process to gather information, assess conditions and identify potential issues or opportunities for improvement.

Work Health and Safety Environment

Fostering a culture of continuous improvement through knowledge sharing and feedback utilising tools such as risk assessments, toolbox meetings, etc, to ensure daily operations are safe and environmentally sustainable.

Value and cost savings

Increasing value and minimising risk

- ForestFit™ Standards are a lead indicator providing growers assurance that certified businesses have systems in place to achieve deliverables.
- Market value can be attributed to certified businesses through demonstrated risk mitigation and minimisation resulting in a lower risk profile for insurance and financing purposes.
- Concomitantly growers should benefit with lowering of their risk profile for engaging certified businesses.

Methodology assumptions

- Steering committee representatives estimated the number of contracted businesses, including how many businesses were contracted to other growers.
- The target estimate aligns with identified businesses contracted to multiple forest growers; which demonstrates how the minimum cost savings for these businesses would quickly compound through recognition of ForestFit™.
- A target of certifying 30 percent of the forest service businesses, based on current modelling, ensures ForestFit™ is fully self funding.
- Costs were disaggregated to per crew for both forester and forest service business case studies; costs originally based on varying business sizes, four and seven crews respectively.
- Average crew estimates of 4 per business, consisting of 3 personnel and equipment were based on an industry economic survey.

- Case studies were provided by a forest grower, forester and a forest service business to estimate the annual cost of assessment activities and identify duplication...



Forester

- Demonstrates annual cost per crew of individual forester time to undertake assessments for harvesting operations.
- Costs preclude travel costs and time to attend sites as these vary generally from 1-3 hours return.
- 75% of time is spent duplicating assessment criteria within the ForestFit™ Standards.
- 25% of current activities would continue for quality and production assessments.


